## From the Pastor's Desk



### “Getting Out of the Boat”

John Ortberg, a Presbyterian pastor, writer, and lecturer, is the author of a book entitled, *If You Want to Walk on Water,*

*You've Got to Get Out of the Boat.* You can probably guess the primary thesis of the book, and its primary scriptural reference. Matthew, Mark, and John all have an account of Jesus walking on the water, but only Matthew includes the familiar addition of Peter wanting to join him (Matthew 14:22-33). Jesus calls to Peter from the surface of the lake, inviting the disciple to come out on the water. Peter steps out of the boat and onto the lake, and for a while he seems to be doing fine as he walks on the lake toward Jesus. But then he becomes frightened by the wind and the waves, and he begins to sink. Jesus reaches out and catches Peter, asking him why it is that he doubts.

John Ortberg wants us to recognize that, although Peter experienced a lapse of faith, he did indeed get out of the boat. A focus on this aspect of the story reminds us that, if we want to walk with Jesus, we have to get out of the boat. According to the author, there is something inside each of us that wants to walk on the water, “to leave the comfort of routine existence and abandon yourself to the high adventure of following God.”

So, the author asks you and me, “What is your boat?” Your boat, he says, is “whatever represents safety and security to you apart from God.” It is whatever pulls you away from the adventure of extreme discipleship, whatever prevents you from stepping out in faith.

All of us have our own boats. They are those values that prevent us from living lives of sold-out discipleship. Things like money, security, family, work, leisure, belongings, and so on. What is your boat?

Jesus calls to us, inviting us to lives of joyful, exciting discipleship, in fellowship with him on the journey. The first step is simply getting out of the boat.

## Session News

The FOCUS Topic for the June Session meeting was consideration of how to assign/arrange Ministry responsibilities among the Session members, with one Session member “retiring” and a former member returning to the Session. In particular we considered how to establish Session leadership responsibility for efforts related to Evangelism and Discipleship, which haven't been explicitly defined as distinct Ministries in the recent past. This discussion was influenced in large measure, although not exclusively, by the recommendations of WRPC's New Beginnings Team. The two related NB Team recommendations were to pursue (1) a renewed focus on (individual, internal) spiritual growth and discipleship and (2) a renewed focus on general visibility (for WRPC) and evangelism. (The third NB recommendation urged WRPC to pursue opportunities to share Mission with other faith communities.)

The Session will return to this topic in August for a discussion and decision on Session Ministry structure for 2015-2016.

On the subject of new Session and Deacon members, the Session thanks retiring Ruling Elder Terry Buxton for his recent years of service on the Session and his many contributions to the Ministry of Support, especially his leadership in maintaining and upgrading our physical facilities. We also thank retiring Deacon Craig Kelly for his recent service on the Board of Deacons.

## Collaborative Missions

Recall that the three primary initiatives for White Rock Presbyterian Church that emerged from the New Beginnings discernment process were (1) a renewed emphasis on personal discipleship for our church and for each of us, (2) a renewed emphasis on evangelism for our church and for each of us, and (3) exploration of collaborative mission enterprises with other churches in our community.

One of the prime potential mission partners identified by the New Beginnings Team is the Santa Fe Korean Presbyterian Fellowship, certainly our nearest neighbor. I recently had a conversation with Reverend Ro regarding the possibility of joint mission between WRPC and the Korean Fellowship.

Reverent Ro informed me that neither his Santa Fe congregation nor his Los Alamos congregation engages actively in mission, for a number of reasons. However, Pastor Ro said that there might very well be some families within either congregation that would embrace the opportunity to engage in mission with us. In particular we discussed the imminent rummage sale (set for July 25) and the possibility of joint participation in a fall trip to work with our friends at the Navajo House of Fellowship.

We will continue to be diligent in inviting our SFKPF friends to join us in mission. What a great opportunity to grow in fellowship and to serve others with our closest Christian neighbors! Please pray about the promising opportunities presented by these joint mission endeavors.

## Science and Faith

The Los Alamos Forum on Faith and Science continues its summer lecture/discussion series on Wednesday evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 pm in Kelly Hall at Trinity on the Hill Episcopal Church. The evening begins with a free dinner! Topics for future presentations include cosmology, evolution, intelligent design, and human origins. In recent weeks some 50 or more people, of all religious persuasions, have gathered for the discussions. Everyone is very welcome.

In August two distinguished faith and science speakers are coming to Los Alamos! Deborah and Loren Haarsma, of the BioLogos Institute and Calvin College, respectively, will be in Los Alamos August 4-6 to present a series of three talks on the intersection of faith and science. The Haarsma's are the authors of the book, *Origins: Christian Perspectives on Creation, Evolution, and Intelligent Design*, which serves as the foundation for the ecumenical faith and science gatherings currently underway on Wednesday nights. The schedule for the three presentations looks like this:

Tuesday, August 4: *God and the Multiverse*, Deborah Haarsma presenting  
Wednesday, August 5: *God, Evolution, and Morality*, Loren Haarsma presenting  
Thursday, August 6: *Evolution and Christianity: Past Present, and Future*, both Haarsma's presenting

The lectures will take place at the new Pajarito Environmental Education Center on Canyon Road, with each one beginning at 7:30 pm.

## Service News

### Manny's Tool Box

The Service Committee has decided to use all of the \$2500 from the dedicated Manny's Tool Box funds to seed a home-repair and construction ministry on the Navajo Nation.

Manny Honig was a member of WRPC and the loving husband of long-time WRPC member Carol Honig, as well as the father of Alison, Steven, and Kristin. He was a servant of the Lord who loved to help people. Being a craftsman himself, and generous with his tools, it is a fitting legacy to establish *MANNY'S TOOL BOX* under the care of Fred and Lorraine Thomas of the Navajo House of Fellowship Church at Bread Springs, New Mexico, 11 miles south of Gallup.

Manny's Tool Box will be a tool-sharing ministry to serve the people of the Navajo Nation in self-help construction projects, under the mentorship of Fred and Lorraine Thomas. Community members will be able to sign a user's agreement in order to borrow tools. The user's agreement will specify the time and date that the tools are checked out and expected time of return and an agreement to return the tools in good working condition. If tools are broken or lost, borrowers will have an opportunity to replace or repair them, in keeping with good stewardship of God's gifts. Fred and Lorraine will supervise the use of the tools, providing side-by-side mentorship in home building and repair. Manny's Tool Box will be kept on the grounds of House of Fellowship Church in a secure location for safekeeping. Fred and Lorraine will take responsibility for keeping the tools safe and secure as well as for teaching the borrowers how to properly use and care for all tools.

Manny's Tool Box will be a vibrant reminder that all gifts are from God and that we are Christ's hands and feet in sharing His gifts with brothers and sisters in our community.

Later in this newsletter you can see a wish list of tools needed to fill the tool box. As you can see, there are many more tools needed than our current funds can supply. If you feel led to make a donation to Manny's Tool Box, you can do so by writing a check to WRPC with "Manny's Tool Box" and the tool you'd like to sponsor on the memo line.

We hope to dedicate Manny's Tool Box on our fall work trip to Bread Springs, where we will build ramps for elderly or infirmed House of Fellowship community members.

## Rummage Sale

Saturday, July 25<sup>th</sup>

The upcoming rummage sale is right around the corner. Before going over the emerging details of the rummage sale and telling you how you might help, let me tell you why we are having a rummage sale. First, a rummage sale is one of the activities, outside of worship, where nearly every member or friend of this congregation participates. Members contribute their rummage, their time setting up and running the sale, and their prayers. In years past, rummage sales have also been opportunities to work with our mission partners from the House of Fellowship (HOF). This year, Lorraine Thomas and other HOF members will again come and participate. Last year we invited members of the community to participate by donating items or even setting up their own sale tables in the parking lot, and we will do the same this year. This year we plan to rely heavily on our youth, and hopefully some other youth from around the

community, to help organize and run the rummage sale. Second, our proceeds will be going towards three excellent youth related causes. We will be splitting proceeds between Young Life Los Alamos Summer Camp scholarships, Julie's Helpers Scholarships for young Navajo women, and Operation Christmas Child. Third, the rummage sale is a chance to increase our visibility in the community and to remind our neighbors of our existence here among them. This year again, we will be sending postcards to every household in White Rock announcing our sale and inviting them to attend, to donate items for sale, or to set up their own sale table in the parking lot. We also plan to have an article in the LA Daily Post and classified ads in the Post and Monitor.

There are several ways to contribute to the success of the upcoming rummage sale. First, bring your rummage. We have started assembling things to sell in the far end of Memorial Hall. Second, volunteer. There will be opportunities for supervision and guidance of our hard working youth on the mornings of the week leading up to the sale and many opportunities on the day of the sale. Keep your eyes open for sign-up sheets the first few weeks of July. Third, recruit a youth to help. We have a small number of youth who will be working very hard to make the rummage sale a success. It would be great if we could recruit a few more local kids (children, grandchildren, neighbors) to work a morning or two. Finally pray that the garage sale will be a success. ## Meet Myoung Ho Yang and Ji Yeon Yoo



The Protestant Churches of Hong Kong founded Chung Chi College in 1951 to provide higher education grounded in both Christian values and Chinese culture. Its focus is on liberal arts education and “whole person development.” Chung Chi is the only constituent college of the Chinese University of Hong Kong with religious roots, and its divinity school is the only program of theological education offered within a public university in China. It grants theological degrees at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral levels. Myoung Ho Yang is a professor of liturgical studies and sacred music in the divinity school.

Both Myoung Ho Yang and Ji Yeon Yoo have long carried a song for mission from Habakkuk 2:14 in their hearts: “For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.” Its rhythm beats with their passion to do God's will.

“It has long been our prayer and desire to serve as an instrument of God's mission,” Myoung Ho says. “The words in Habakkuk have been our song.”

Myoung Ho comes to mission service with experience as a pastor, professor, and worship leader. He has been worship pastor at two congregations in New Jersey, and pastor of the Korean congregation of Westminster

Presbyterian Church in Manchester, New Hampshire. Prior to moving to the United States, Myoung Ho earned a B.A. in accounting from Chung Ang University and an M.B.A. in international business from Yonsei University. He is a teaching elder and member of Eastern Korea Presbytery.

Ji Yeon has been involved in ministries of hospitality and Bible teaching in the churches her husband has served.

Myoung Ho and Ji Yeon want to work alongside Chinese Christians in a quest for more faithful discipleship and a global understanding of the gospel.

“We hope the church will shine the light of the truth and play an essential role in the coming of the Kingdom of God in the world by living out the Word of God and actively engaging in world mission,” Ji Yeon says.

Christianity was introduced in China in 635 CE by Nestorian missionaries. Many Protestant groups, including the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), began sending missionaries to China in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.
